The annual teen all-niter was held in June. We had fewer this year, as several of our youth have finished High School and gone off to university. There were 14 of us, which actually was a very good number for me to work with in a more personal way. We sat down in a circle and discussed who will we serve with our lives. I addressed that several of them soon were going to be making decisions that would affect the rest of their lives. I asked them if they had asked God what He wanted them to do. Sometimes I think we get so wrapped up in what we want to do that we forget to seek God and what He wants for us.
