We were greatly blessed by each conference and were able to meet back up with friends we had made the last time we were there, as well as make some new friends. We were able to see some people come to know the Lord as their personal Savior and make decisions for Christ. Thank you so much for the great hospitality each church showed us while we were there. You all were a true blessing to our family. From New Mexico we drove to Colorado and then to Kentucky, both for new support. We praise the Lord for His leading us to partner with these churches.

The first of April, after about a week in PA, we headed back to Virginia and reported to many of our supporting churches in that area. It was great to be with churches that have supported us over these past 10 years while in New Zealand, and some even before we were on the field. They all were a true blessing to us. We also were able to be in two more churches in Virginia for new support. Again, we praise the Lord for partnering us with churches that are excited about missions.

Though we are still about ten thousand (USD) short of having the funds to complete the residing, we are going to seek out quotes to have two-three sides done this year. We are also short of about five thousand (USD) for finishing the rewiring.
