We prayed about this opportunity, took the church through the house to see the potential for using it for Sunday School classes, Children's church, NZBBTP classes, etc... We held a meeting and decided not to purchase the building, but to continue fixing up what we have and possibly add to it in the future. Through all of this, the people have been motivated to increase their giving to the building fund.

Debbie spoke at the September Women of Virtue program, on Music, Movies, and Media. We had a good turnout. She handed out booklets on godly music, The Blessings and Pitfalls of Social Networking, and also booklets on drinking alcohol and dress. It was all received very well. Some of the ladies that were not able to attend, asked for the material and notes that had been handed out. They all said music is a big area where they struggle.

As we read the news and see the events that are happening around he world, we know that our time is drawing short. We feel an urgency to get the Gospel to as many people as we can. It is exciting for us to see our people reaching out to the lost in their neighborhoods, schools, and work areas. We still have the freedom to preach the Gospel, but as we see reports, even in the United States, of our religious rights being taken from us, we need to stand strong and persevere.
